




I give thanks to my God for every remembrance of you, always praying with joy for all of you in my every prayer, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now.

Heights Church Family,

One of the core practices of the people of God is stopping to look back to name, remember and celebrate the faithfulness of God. Each year we produce this report in order to help us do just that together: name, remember and celebrate.

As I reflect on 2023, it's hard to put into words what a phenomenal year of growth and favor it has been for us as the Body of Christ. Right before our eyes, Jesus is delivering on his promise to build his church and we want to stop to take time to reflect and celebrate His work through our hands.

2023 was "The Year of Authentic Community." We spent a full year looking at what it looked like to build a haven of relational beauty in the church that would shine the light of Christ to the world. On January 8, 2023, I preached a sermon out of Acts 2 on the three foundations of the New Testament Church: Truth, Power and Discipleship. By God's grace we have seen each of these foundations laid over the past year.

We spent the majority of our year centering ourselves around the truth of God's word in the book of 1 Corinthians. We covered some of the most controversial topics of our time and allowed God's voice, through his Word, to be the clarifying center of everything we do. I am proud of us for the way we stand on Truth.

But, truth alone doesn't work. We also need the power of the Spirit of God. We need the same wind and fire to fall on us as they did on the church in Acts 2. As I reflect on 2023 I am encouraged that it seems the Spirit is doing a fresh work in many of you. The fruit of the Spirit is abundant and the gifts of the Spirit have been unleashed in new ways. I am proud of us for the way we are "walking in the Spirit."

And where Spirit and Truth come together, discipleship to Jesus happens. And this is what I am most thankful for. As you will see, we baptized more people this past year than we ever have in our church's short history. The lost are being found through the Alpha course. The found are being discipled in the many new environments we have launched over the past year (institute, Bible studies, community groups). Works of mercy and justice are being multiplied through Lovewell Colfax. I am proud of how we take discipleship to Jesus seriously.

As a pastor, I could not be more thankful to be a part of what God is doing among us. I am thankful for you and your sacrifice, generosity, and passion for the gospel. It is a gift to be one of your pastors.

{OCTOBER}


We hosted our first ever Candypalooza for The Heights Kids. Volunteers and kids alike dressed up and had a blast!

Quinn's Story


I was lost. When I looked at our world I could see only the possibility of more hatred, war, poverty, sickness and unhappiness. As for myself; the hedonistic pleasures of life along with the desires for wealth, power and recognition were not enough to keep me moving forward. My life was marked by sin which caused me great shame. This dark outlook brought me depression and crushed my spirit.

Jesus found me and renewed my passion for life. In Him I saw a greater power I could rely upon and a model for what a truly meaningful life could be built around. No longer did I have to bear the burdens of this world alone. One day last December I walked by the Heights and decided to come to the service on Sunday where I was warmly welcomed. I enjoyed a service unlike any I had attended before and have been coming ever since. The weekly sermons and guidance I received from the staff and community were pivotal for me on my journey back to faith.

I now wake up every morning and strive to be more like Jesus as he helps me grow in the fruit of the Holy Spirit. My selfish desires are being replaced with the desire to love God and others. Now everyday I'm overwhelmed by the joy in my heart. God has blessed me with incredible new friends and a supportive church in the loneliest time of my life. He has given me strength and discipline to be a better man. I now look to Jesus to relieve me of my sins and replace the shame in my heart with love. And even though I know there will be hard times ahead; I now have an ultimate hope for the future - to be with God and enjoy him forever.







Natalia's Story

I was not raised in the Church. I was raised in a home with parents who didn't want to impose any belief structures on me, so I could explore and make decisions for myself. This left me curious and seeking, but I found myself seeking in the wrong places. I wound up deep in "New Age" spirituality, and it became a very dark place. This spirituality was oriented around psychic work, and I had opened myself up to so much I didn't comprehend. I began to experience intense spiritual warfare. I deeply isolated myself and alienated people dear to my heart. My participation in this community almost ruined my life.

But two very important people didn't give up on me. One is my boyfriend, who patiently held on while I drifted off. The other person who didn't give up on me is Jesus himself. What I have come to know on this journey is that God, that Jesus, didn't give up on me. He loves me, he loves us, so much.

Rebuilding after I got home was a slow process. I attended the Heights off and on, but a year after my return to Colorado, I was struggling. I was listening to a sermon on the miracles of the New Testament Church, and had just finished hearing about God showing himself through wind and fire at Pentecost. I started praying to God, tears streaming down my face, when the back door blew open. I said, "Ok, God. I surrender. Show me your plan." I read C.S. Lewis's Mere Christianity and listened to every single Heights sermon on Spotify in about a month. This summer I went to Alpha and was able to ask more questions and share my current understanding with other participants and our amazing facilitators. During the week where we discussed the Holy Spirit, I let someone pray for me for the first time and felt so much emotion come over me. I wasn't ready to say it out loud then, but I knew I would be up here before the year was over.

Now, I am a part of the Women's Bible study, diving into the word of God in community for the first time. I still have questions and curiosities, but I know that Jesus found me, that he died in my place, and that he was raised from the dead so I could be forgiven, and as I sit here in a horse trough in front of you all, I do so with deep gratitude and awe for who Jesus is, and how he saved me.






Alessandra's Story

I was lost – I was in an abusive relationship, I felt trapped, and I was depressed. I was unhappy with who I was and the course that my life was taking. During the lowest point in my relationship, I felt called into a deeper relationship with God. I felt curious but confused and even scared.

One day, my uncle, who is Christian and knew what I was going through, gave me call. He said "if you want your life to change, hand it over to God." In that moment, I knew I had to go all in. I started reading the Bible every day and learning about what it meant to have a relationship with God. I recently read the Gospels and began to truly understand who Jesus was and his mission on this Earth. Jesus came so that we could live in freedom and that we could experience an abundant life with him forever. Since I made the decision to seek God's word daily, I have gone through an extreme makeover of my mind and heart.

One night when I went to bed and the anxiety was so overwhelming that the tears would not stop falling, I did the only thing that brought me comfort. I prayed with all my faith: "Jesus, if you are willing, please take this away." And just like that, my thoughts and feelings were still. I felt at ease and I knew Jesus was with me.

God has provided for me every day since I made the decision to follow Him. I was able to leave that abusive relationship, move to a different state, and get a new job.



Discipleship Spaces

At The Heights, we're not interested in being converts, but rather we believe that Jesus calls us to be deep disciples. A disciple of Jesus is someone who has been saved by Jesus and now orients all of life around him and his kingdom.

This year, we took a big step in creating new spaces for discipleship to happen here at The Heights. We launched 4 new discipleship spaces: Women's Bible Study, Men's Bible Study, The Heights Institute, and Alpha. Each of these spaces supplemented the discipleship happening in community groups around the city by providing dedicated environments to grow deeper.

Not only was this a year of significant WIDE growth (attendance, membership, baptisms), but it was also a landmark year for DEEP growth with the launch of these new spaces.





Alpha

This past year we launched Alpha in a brand new space! Alpha is a space for agnostics, atheists, and skeptics to explore faith. God was gracious to us by giving us a free place to meet over at Bruz on Fax. The new location has created an environment that feels more welcoming to skeptics and we have seen Alpha grow with over 35 attendees this year.

Men's Bible Study

In 2023 we hosted 4 Men's breakfasts to lead up to the launch of our brand new Men's Bible study. We saw over 90 men sign up to participate in the Bible study as a result of these breakfasts.





Women's Bible Study

In 2023 we launched a women's Bible study with two different meeting times. We now have over 100 Women enrolled in these Bible studies.

Heights Institute

In September we launched The Heights Institute — an intensive, 24 week course that walks through Christian theology and the Christian story. Twenty students began the Institute and will finish up this spring. A new class will begin in the fall with applications opening soon.



The Heights Kids

2023 was a landmark year of God's faithfulness to our Heights Kids ministry. We began the year in January averaging 42 kids each Sunday, and in December averaged 92 kids throughout the month!

We also hosted so many fun celebrations during the year! We hosted friends at a trampoline park party in February, celebrated Easter with an egg hunt at Crestmoor Park, partied at Kids Camp in June, wore costumes to church and played games at Candypalooza, packed bags for unhoused friends at our Christmas Lovewell bag packing, and celebrated Christmas with over 40 kids at our Elementary Christmas Party.






